Title I Annual Meeting

All Jacksboro ISD campuses participate in Title I, Part A (schoolwide) to improve student academic achievement. School districts receiving Title I, Part A funds are required to convene an annual parent meeting:

- to inform parents and families of their school's participation
- to explain the requirements of the Title I, Part A program
- to explain the right of parents to be involved

Requirements of the Title I, Part A program:

- Provide high-quality academic assessments
- Provide supplemental services and support to assist struggling students
- Implement strategies to promote parent and family involvement in school programs
- Encourage parent involvement in the development of the school's Title I, Part A plan



Role of Parents

As parents, you are encouraged to be involved in the school's programs by volunteering in your child's classroom, observing classroom activities, participating in decisions related to the education of your children, assisting in the review and revision of the district's parent and family engagement policy, compact, and Title I plan.

Use of Funds

Jacksboro ISD receives approximately **\$202,000** in federal Title I funds annually. These funds are used for the following purposes:

- Salaries for teachers and paraprofessionals assigned to assist students who are at-risk of not meeting rigorous state academic standards.
- Supplemental resources and supplies intended to improve student academic achievement

Curriculum and Assessment

Jacksboro ISD uses the **TEKS Resource System** as the primary curriculum to guide instruction in grades Kindergarten through 12.

All Jacksboro ISD campuses use a **Data Driven Instruction** model to assess student progress in mathematics, reading, science, and social studies. Data from four checkpoint assessments administered throughout the year, allow teachers and administrators to evaluate student progress toward mastery of state academic standards and identify students in need of academic interventions.

State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR®)

Students in grades 3-8 must take the following STAAR tests: reading (grades 3-8), mathematics (grade 3-8), writing (grades 4&7), science (grades 5&8), and social studies (grade 8). Students enrolled in the following high school courses must take an End of Course assessment: Algebra I, Biology, English I & II, and U.S. History.
