



School Health Advisory Council

Minutes of Meeting

The School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) of Jacksboro ISD met on October 27, 2021, at 12:00 noon in the Jacksboro ISD Board Room at 750 W Belknap, in Jacksboro, Texas. The following items were discussed:

Agenda

1. Welcome - SHAC Chair, Alinda Cox called the meeting to order at 12:08 pm
2. Introduce new members - new members to the 2021-22 SHAC include Grizelda Salazar (JISD Nurse), Matt Windham (Jacksboro PD), Larrin Alsip (JES Parent), and Shilo Cornish (JMS Parent).
3. Child nutrition update - Brad Burnett provided a child nutrition update. The district is participating in a Texas Department of Agriculture program that provides free meals (breakfast, lunch, and afternoon snack) to all students in the district regardless of the family's financial status. The district still requires parents to complete the Free/Reduced (F/R) meal application in order for their child to be issued a Chromebook. The F/R application determines the amount of state and federal funds received by the district. The F/R application is also required to determine ACT/SAT fee waivers for eligible students.
4. Review the District's response to COVID-19
 - a. [JISD Public Health Plan](#) - Brad Burnett showed the council members where to locate the district's public health plan on the JISD website. The plan was updated in September 2021.
 - b. [Telehealth partnership with Faith Community Hospital](#) - Grizelda Salazar reported on the district's partnership with Faith Community Hospital to provide telehealth services to JISD students and staff. Mrs. Salazar stated that parents are very grateful for the telehealth option. Some of the benefits include testing students for flu and strep on-campus, parents not having to take off work to take their children to the clinic, prescriptions sent directly to the pharmacy. The telehealth partnership also helps reduce the traffic through the FCH clinic.
 - c. [Reporting of COVID-19 cases](#) - Mr. Burnett showed the council where the district reports active COVID-19 cases on the JISD website.
5. [FCH Flu Shot Clinic](#) for Staff and Students - Oct. 26-27, 2021 - Mrs. Salazar reported that over 200 students and staff received a flu shot.

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6. State-mandated training related to health & wellness - Mr. Burnett provided the council with information about the district's compliance with the following state-mandated meetings:
 - a. Mental Health First Aid - staff training delivered through Safe Schools training platform.
 - b. Dating Violence Prevention, Healthy Relationships- staff training delivered through Safe Schools training platform.
 - c. Bullying Awareness and Prevention- staff training delivered through Safe Schools training platform.
 - d. Stop the Bleed - Staff & Students (grades 7-12) - Officer Windham trained all staff during August In-Service. Student training is scheduled for 2021-22.
 - e. BLS/CPR/AED - Staff & Students (grades 9-12) - Training for Seniors is scheduled for Nov. 16, 2021

7. Health & wellness updates by campus
 - a. Elementary - Teresa Howard, JES Counselor, reported on the following activities:
 - i. Red Ribbon Week (Oct. 25-29) Dress up themes and awareness activities.
 - ii. Healthy relationships provided by Wise Hope for 4th and 5th-grade students.
 - iii. 7 students have been referred for outside counseling services.
 - iv. Mrs. Howard is focusing on 5th grade to promote positive relationships.
 - v. The district received a grant through Region 9 to set up a framework to prepare students for college and career readiness. The grant is currently in the planning stage.
 - b. Middle School - Terrie Stretcher, JMS Counselor, reported on the following activities:
 - i. Anxiety counseling and grief recovery counseling.
 - ii. STOMP leadership training for 7th grade.
 - iii. Healthy relationships by Wise Hope for 8th grade.
 - iv. Use of Rhythm app (Social-Emotional tracking) in grades K-12.
 - v. Upcoming staff development sponsored by STOMP titled "Tall Cop Says STOP". This training will help staff identify illegal drugs.
 - c. High School - Dori Taylor, JHS Counselor, reported on the following activities:
 - i. Wise Hope Healthy Relationships presentation to 9th grade.
 - ii. 10th-grade Mental Health training
 - iii. 11th & 12th-grade adult reality classes.

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- iv. STOMP will provide a drug prevention assembly in the spring semester.
8. SHAC priorities for 2021-22 - The following priorities were established by the council:
 - a. Diabetes awareness training for faculty
 - b. Distracted driving simulator for high school students, Alinda Cox has a contact for the simulator.
 - c. Welcome to the Real World program for 11th-grade students, this program is available through the Texas Agri-life Extension Service
 9. Schedule next meeting for Spring 2022 - the SHAC spring meeting will be scheduled for late March 2022. The SHAC Annual Report will be presented to the JISD School Board at the April 2022 board meeting.
